The June 23rd District D track & field meet was a hot one at York University however the temperatures did not stop the will and determination that these young athletes displayed in the total of 45 events for boys and girls, midgets and youth.

It was not only the athletes that struggled in the heat it was the many Legion volunteers some wearing their full uniforms under the blazing sun. What a magnificent roll they played on the field that day both in presenting the medals at the winner's podium or to ensuring that registration, lunch, results were collected from the coaches and then turned in, printed and then relayed on down. All important rolls that helped the day go smoothly. Also, many thanks to our very own James Smith who stayed the day to assist when volunteers were in short supply.

The July 5-6 Provincials at Laurentian University held in Sudbury this year was the precursor to the TEAM ONTARIO to compete at the Nationals in Langley B.C.. District D garnered some gold (18), silver (9) and bronze (9) for a TOTAL OF 36.

Some of the interesting events at both Provincials and Nationals are the **PENTATHALON** where athletes compete in **five different events** and are awarded points for the best all round athlete. The **HEPTHALON** is for junior and senior women and this comprises of **seven events**. And then there is the **OCTATHLON** which is for under 17 youth boys and under 15 midget and is made up of **eight events**. These events are a competition against oneself and the scoring tables, with the aim to score more points than the other competitors. It is a test of mind and body; challenging the persons character, attitude, and determination and their physical abilities.

Functional fitness Training



Starting on September 14, 2013 from 11:30 am to 1:00 pm on the 3rd floor and running for 10 weeks, members and friends of Branch 11 are invited to participate in an exciting fitness program designed to support and build on primal movements that make up all of the activities of daily living, recreation and sporting activities we do on a regular basis. These primal movements are pushing, pulling, bending, squatting, twisting and lunging. Another key component to being able to move easily is core strength and we will be looking at interesting ways to help improve this and reduce back pain, correct postural imbalances and help to make day to day moving easier.

We will be using body weight, resistance bands and some light weights in order to develop strength, power, endurance, balance, coordination and flexibility. We will use a variety of circuit training methods and all movements will go through safe progressions. Everybody regardless of experience will benefit. The goal is to perform your personal best and achieve maximum results over the ten weeks.

Ideally we will have a minimum of twelve participants, the more the merrier, and there will be a small fee to attend the sessions. I will be donating a portion of the proceeds back to the Branch to support it and the Branch's programs.
