Please make sure that you mark your calendar for the dates for the nominations and election meeting;

Nominations: Wednesday April 1<sup>st</sup>. 8:00 pm

Elections: Wednesday May 6<sup>th</sup> 7:30 pm Note earlier time.

#### NOMINATIONS: Wednesday April 1st 8:00pm

Nominations can be made for the positions of President, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, six Executive Committee members and the Sergeant-at-Arms. If you want to be on next years Executive you must be at the nomination meeting to accept your nomination or give a letter to either the Secretary or President stating your intentions.

All Life, Ordinary, Associate and Affiliate Voting members in good standing shall be eligible to be elected to any office providing they have the following requirements:

- 1) to be eligible for election as President, 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Presidents, you must have completed one full term on the Executive Council or served on a council at a higher level of the Legion within the last three (3) years.
- 2) to be eligible for election to the Branch Executive or as Sergeant-at-Arms, you shall have been a member of the Branch for at least one year immediately prior to the elections and have attended at least five (5) General Meetings in the preceding term, from June to April.

Due to the Branch regulations now in effect, after the elections and before the May Executive Meeting, all chairman will be appointed by the President but all appointments need to be approved by the Executive Committee members and then by the General body at the June General meeting before the appointments are official.

Elections: Wednesday May 6<sup>th</sup>, 7:30 pm.

To be eligible to vote you will be required to show your 2015 membership card to the Sgt-at-Arms at the door. Please make sure you bring your 2015 membership card with you. We would like a number of the new members to our Branch to come out and exercise their right to participate in the

election process. All members are urged to attend this important meeting to elect your Executive for the next term which is now two (2) years; you are the people that elect/create the Executive. Many members of the Branch have lots to say in the clubroom about the abilities of the Executives who get elected but if you don't exercise your right to vote for **your** Executive, it really isn't fair to them to keep getting criticized, please come out and vote.

**Dear Sheila:** A car stalling after being driven a short distance can be caused by a variety of faults with the engine. Start by checking that there is no debris in the fuel line. If it is clear check the vacuum, pipes and hoses on the intake manifold and also check all ground wires. If none of these approaches solve the problem it could be that the fuel pump itself is faulty, causing low delivery pressure to the injectors.
