Poppy



The Zone D3 Poppy meeting was held in March and after some discussions new boundaries were established, For Branch 11 this is significant as we will now be taking over a portion of Branch 1/42's old area, while retaining all our old area including the Don Mills which we are covering for Branch 22. We will again also most likely be asked to help out with tagging at both the Eaton Centre and maybe the Air Canada Centre as we did in 2015.

Our Poppy area now extends south from the present southern boundary the railway land south of Danforth Ave. to Woodbine Ave. The area has basically doubled in size .While most of this is residential, there are major

commercial and retail areas on Kingston and Queen streets that will need to be serviced with counter boxes and perhaps taggers. In addition the new area includes nine new schools.

While the good news is that we will probably see a major increase in the amount of money we collect in the Poppy Campaign there is a cost. This is going to require a lot of effort and much more work from our volunteers who I know are already stretched to the limit.

I have already started planning on how to deal with this increase. I will be in touch with my opposite number at Branch 1/42 to obtain any contact and other details on the schools and businesses we are now responsible for. After that I will conduct an in person visit to all stores, restaurants, businesses etc. over the summer to introduce myself and determine if they wish a counter box and/or have a space for taggers. When this is done I will have a realistic idea of both how many boxes, poppies and other supplies we will need and how many more people will be needed.

Hopefully our cadets will be able to help, and I am also looking at other groups. One of our new members, Mike Turner, is involved with a local Venture group in the new area and hopefully their knowledge and assistance will be made available to us.

Even with these two groups we are going to need more drivers to deliver and replenish counter boxes and more taggers and persons to sort and count the money as it comes in. Every one of us took an oath when we joined the Legion to actively participate in the Poppy Campaign. I am asking all who are able to do so and remember that oath next October and November. Every little bit helps.

Veterans Service Officer

At the Service Officer seminar held in Aurora many new ideas were discussed on how we as a Legion can better help and serve our Veterans. One idea is what should happen with the Veterans Wing at Sunnybrook.

At present the agreement with Government of Canada is that when the last WW2 or Korean War Vet passes away that entire facility will cease to be a Veterans Hospital and Sunnybrook can then be used as they best see fit.

The Veterans Wing at Sunnybrook, as many who have visited it are aware, is an excellent facility where those who have served this country can stay in comfort and dignity during their sunset years. Few want to give up their homes and live in a hospital or long care facility, however for those who have no other options this is the best choice available to them.

One of the reasons it is such a state of the art facility is the time, effort and money that the Royal Canadian Legion has invested in it. That time, effort and money was for our Veteran Community and under present agreement that someday in the future will no longer be the case.

We presently have in access of 500,000 Veterans who served after the Korean War ended. They served in the Cold War, The Persian Gulf War, various UN and NATO Peacekeeping and Peace Enforcement Missions around the world, in Afghanistan and Libya and now Iraq. When the time comes for some of them to enter a long term care facility, where will they who also served this country go if Sunnybrook is no longer open and available to them.

It was decided at the Service Officer seminar that we as Legion members should do something about this. The decision was made to start a letter writing campaign to our Members of Parliament asking them to reconsider this decision and keep Sunnybrook a Veterans Hospital for present and future generations of Veterans so that they too can enjoy a modicum of dignity and care.

I will be posting both in the clubroom and on the Branch website and Facebook page the letter and encouraging all members of Branch 11 to copy it, sign and send it to their respective Members of Parliament.
