#### **Poppy**



As I write this submission, the 2016 Poppy campaign is finally drawing to an end with most of the boxes in and the donations accounted for. I don't have a complete total yet but should have it by the December general meeting and will announce then. For those not present I'll ensure it in the next newsletter.

I will say that it is looking like we will probably surpass 2015's total which I had hoped to. I do have some other numbers though to share. First our cadets once again came through for us and in two Saturdays of tagging doubled what they brought in last year with just under \$10,000.00.

As I've said since the spring our Poppy area has doubled in size and we've begun to adjust to this. The number of schools we have now more than doubled and as always the Ladies Auxiliary ensured that all the students received a Poppy or Poppy sticker in their own envelope.

Last year we had a total of 205 counter boxes out, 140 at one time, the other 65 were replacements for those filled and being counted. This year we had 326 boxes out at any one time. There were sufficient spares to ensure that these numbers were maintained, as was the increase in frequency in counting and rolling, allowing a quick turnaround of boxes.

Last year out of that 140 we had two boxes reported stolen. This year out of those 326, so far only one.

The increase in school and counter box donations will account for any improvement or success this year over previous ones, however in one important area we were down tagging.

According to the board we had 851 tagging spots that is 851 two hour shifts at any of the 14 locations now

in our area. Only 180 of those shifts were filled, and in those 180, 53 shifts were done by cadets.

That means 127 tagging shifts were filled by Branch members. Some of those shifts did have two people at them, but in many cases someone did two, three, four or in one case fifteen shifts. The above does not include the four taggers we sent to the air Canada Center and the four to the Eaton Center in support of Branch 22.

671 Shifts were unfilled, that's 1342 hours where we did not have a tagging presence in our area at least at some place. There were many reasons why the number of taggers were down, some were discussed at the November meeting, but reasons don't really matter, just the potential consequences.

To add to this many taggers also reported that they felt they were getting less money this year compared to last, Even with an increase in counter boxes and schools we need to be prepared for possible lower returns in the future and develop plans to work around it.

About 53 members of the Branch tagged this year and a total of 67 helped in some manner with the Poppy Campaign, counting, rolling, driving, re-building boxes and numerous other jobs, many doing more than one. That's less than 70 people out of a membership of over 400 who kept their oath to actively participate in the Poppy Campaign.

I know that of the remaining 300 plus there are those who can no longer help due to their age and/or medical condition, and I understand you did your share in years past and I thank you. Other members don't live nearby, although I hope you did volunteer in some way near where you live. For those who did participate and kept their oath, you have my gratitude and sincere thanks. For those for whatever reason did not, I'm sure you had you had your reason.

I'm going to end this on a positive note. Earlier this week Cathy Cole gave me a note that was in one of the envelopes we distributed to students. On it was printed in pencil:

"I'm sorry I only had 25 cents, It's the best I could do! Thanks for everything."

No matter what the final total of donations was this year that note, that declaration that some young

person was willing to give all they had made it all worthwhile.

The next day the lady running the group contacted Helen for some more information and advised she is submitting her application to Branch 286 – well done Jay.

November 11<sup>th</sup> – back in June Helen received a request from a teacher at Leo Baeck School for a Veteran to speak. As a result Mike Turner graciously volunteered as did Rick Groome and together the trio struck out on a TTC adventure to that school in the west end. It turned out to be a very rewarding adventure. Mike was called up to give a 15 minute presentation to 200 students ranging from grades 4 to 8, after which Rick joined Mike at the podium to answer questions. Both gentlemen were amazed at the questions and interest from the students. They stayed on an extra hour to accommodate all the questions – kudos guys!

**November 19<sup>th</sup>** – Judging of the Remembrance contest entries was done. There were 115 entries, down considerably and sadly no entries from any of the new

schools Branch 11 has inherited as a result of the Poppy area restructure plus no high school entries. However, our regular supporters – George Webster, Gledhill and Secord came through with flying colours! We have 9 first place entries going on to Zone and will be going into those schools in January to present the Branch's awards and Certificate to each 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winners:

A few updates since my last submission to the newsletter.

First of all we have received our copies of Volume Three of the Military Service Recognition Book and while not all the submissions from Branch members were published I have been assured by Aurora that those still outstanding will be in Volume Four next year. A couple of our members were in this edition and I'll ensure they receive a copy as will all local schools and libraries. A copy will also be placed in the clubroom alongside the other two volumes for those
