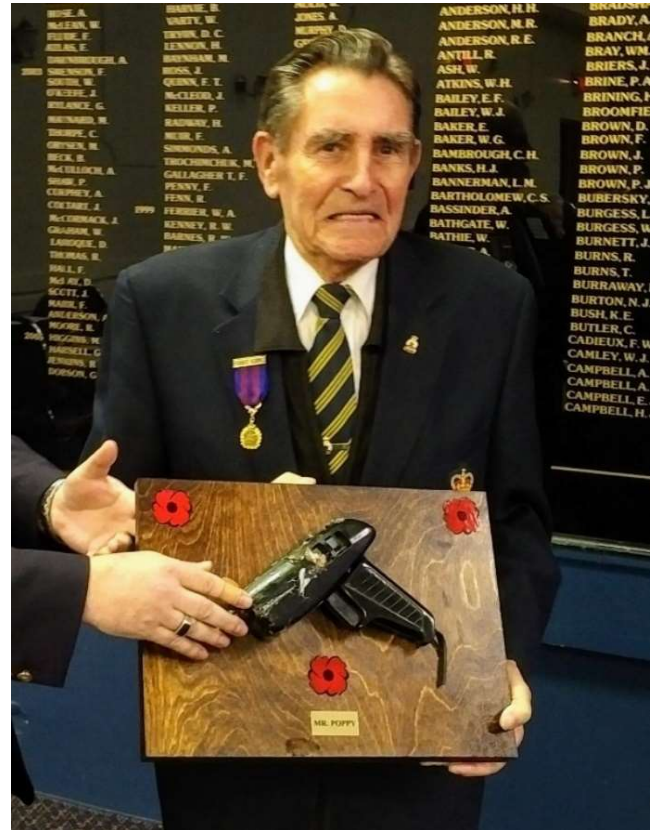
with him throughout Canada, the United States, the United Kingdom, Ireland and Europe.
