

October is here and that means cooler weather, jackets and the Poppy Campaign!!

This year the Campaign will start on Friday October 25th and conclude on November 11th.

I have been busy getting the counter and tagging boxes ready for this year. The poppies and supplies are at the branch and we are ready for an awesome poppy campaign! All we need is wonderful volunteers like you to assist in making it all happen.

As the Branch and Zone Veteran Service Officer, I see and meet many of the Veterans and their families that our Poppy funds assist directly. The support and changes these funds provide is heartwarming and so greatly appreciated. The funds that assist these veterans and their families gives them hope and the ability to get back on their feet. I truly wish I could share with you the experiences of watching a family smile and cry out of happiness for what we were able to do for them through the poppy fund and the support of our branch members. This past year the funds assisted getting Veterans and their families food and medical supplies, assisting with first and last month rent for homeless families and individuals as well as enabling others to obtain hearing aids and emergency dental work; the list goes on with the types of support the poppy funds contribute to.

So I ask every one of you to please assist me in the poppy campaign this year, no matter how much or little time you can commit to; the support will be greatly appreciated.

The Branch area has not changed from past years. It is from Victoria Park Ave to Woodbine Ave and from St Clair Ave down to the water front. Outside of our area we have The Real Canadian Super Store, Shops at Don Mills and we will have opportunities to tag at the Scotiabank Arena (Former ACC) as well.

There was a recent change in Poppy areas within our zone and we now have the opportunity to assist Branch #344 with their area. This will include the Scotiabank Arena (Former ACC), Bay Towers, Dundas Square and Spadina Ave from Dundas St north to Bloor St and the Eaton Centre.

I will be putting the Tagging Board up in the Clubroom on October 2nd. I have a non-tagging sign-up sheet on the clubroom bar. Please feel free to put your name on either or both forms to assist with poppy services. The poppy Tagging Board is set up this year in two hour time slots. If you can tag for 2 hours or more feel free to put your name on the time and location you wish to tag. If you are only able to help for an hour or even 15 minutes please do the same and write your availability of time beside your name. (There will be a dashed line between the 2 hour block so another person could put their name to cover the other hour).

We will be offering the Wristband Packages again this year for \$5.00 each. They will consist of a "Lest We Forget" Wristband, a Poppy Pin Centre and a "Lest We Forget" poppy ceramic pin. If any branch member would like several of these packages to sell please contact me and I will have them ready for you as soon as possible.

Thank you all for your greatly appreciated support and I look forward to assisting you all to make this an Awesome Campaign!


