

5-year Planning Committee

Comrades:

First and foremost, I would like to express my regrets that I have been unable to share the undernoted information with you prior to this time. This was the result of the strict confidentiality requirements demanded from all participants due to the delicate extensive continuing negotiations of several parties. If things were not completed March 20, 2020 there would be nothing to discuss. I trust that you will all understand.

As of today March 20, 2020, the current developer of 9 Dawes Road and 25 Dawes Road – 9 Dawes Development Inc. has transferred ownership of the property to a new developer. The new Developer Minto Communities of the Minto Group (aka Minto) will be required to assume all the obligations to the Branch contained in our original Agreement. Jeff O'Rielly a VP of Minto Communities did contact me after the close of the deal... First, he apologized that he was not able to speak to us due to the strict

confidentially requirements... and confirmed they plan to honour the agreement with the previous developer... and want to meet with us in the near future.

As part of the original Agreement, Branch 11 had provided the Purchaser with a Vendor Take Back loan for \$7,007,000 and as security had a first mortgage lien on the 9 Dawes Road property. Minto had suggested that the Legion accept the status of a second mortgage because the prime lender for the combined project would be holding first security. Your financial sub-committee did not agree to this dilution of the Branch's security. As a result, on March 20, 2020 the Branch has now received the full payment of the mortgage and accrued interest amounting to \$7,014,658. This money has been transferred to the existing Capital Investment Fund currently being managed on behalf of the Branch by Richardson GMP Limited. Your Financial Planning Sub-Committee, consisting of Comrade John Dufort, Mr. Ed Kenny and myself assisted by our legal counsel Mr. Jon Venutti, are confident that with this payout the assets of the Branch have been fully protected.

Within the next few weeks, we expect to have detailed discussions with Minto with respect to its plans for the property. Although the mortgage has been paid out, the original Agreement stipulates that the Branch will remain at 9 Dawes Road, with zero rent until at least October 4, 2021. There are also significant additional benefits stipulated in the Agreement.

Within the next couple of weeks, we will be reviewing a comprehensive Investment Plan with Richardson GMP to not only to include this additional \$7+ million but also to mitigate the effects of the catastrophic impact of the current world markets collapse.

We are in the process of updating our 5-year Development Plan. More to follow.
