




Upon reading Nancy McKnight's report, it is good to hear that **Helen Small** is now home from her hospital stint.

Good Day:

As a NATO Veteran and 56 year Legion member, I am committed to support an important Canadian initiative to have a War Memorial Monument built on Cape Breton Island to honour those who paid the supreme war sacrifice never made it back home.

Once completed, this long overdue initiative titled *Never to be Forgotten*, will see a large monument erected on Cape Breton Island. A statue of *Mother Canada* (Vimy Monument Lady), who will face East with open arms to welcome our absent fallen.

Individuals and organizations across the country are participating in this valued project and I am seeking your support from Provincial-to pass on this email information to broadcast Branch support from comrades, friends, family and other business associates. The more contacts that sign this Federal petition, the better.

Numerous individual RCL Branches have already made the decision to come on board, and petition signatures are mounting rapidly, but not all Branches are aware of its existence. So please consider passing it on to your District and Zone Branches.
